Recently, NorthSTAR was called upon to transport a patient with a traumatic brain injury to an out-of-state Level 1 Trauma Center. When the crew landed, they were met with some unforeseen problems in accessing the elevator. The following letter was written from the Trauma Director of this facility to Hosseinali Shahidi, MD, MPH, Assistant Professor, Emergency Department.

I would like to commend your NorthSTAR Flight Crew for responding so well to the unexpected situation. They include: Flight Nurse, Marybeth Wiedemann, Flight Paramedic, Rick Witzel, and New Jersey State Troopers, Dan Vanco and Patrick Balunis. Based on their judgment of the acuity of this patient's injuries, balanced against the time necessary to reload the patient and move her to another facility, they made the calculated decision to carry the patient down two flights of steps where elevator access was made available. I believe, that in the interest of assuring the most immediate evaluation of the patient, this was an appropriate and valiant decision. The crew is to be commended for their commitment to quality patient care.

When your child gets sick while traveling, it is a very frightening experience, as expressed in the following letter by a thankful father.

I would like to express my utmost gratitude to paramedics, **Charlene Barber**, **John McAleer** and **Andrew Koehler**. I was

traveling from New Jersey to Washington, DC, when my young son fell ill in Penn Station. He suffers from a life-threatening illness called mitochondrial disease. His symptoms are primarily in the GI tract, including terrible nausea. It can escalate very quickly to the point where he requires urgent hospitalization and high doses of IV medication. The paramedic team arrived very quickly. Each person was amazing. This was the only team that successfully put an IV into my son in the ambulance (within 5 seconds); obtained an EKG; and did a finger stick, which showed low blood sugar. The EMT's administered glucose and by the time we arrived in your ED, my son was already feeling better. When you go through difficult times, it means the world to encounter people like Charlene, John and Andy. I appreciate their kindness, compassion and professionalism.

Gloria Igwe, NM, and the nurses of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), received this heartfelt letter from a very grateful, new mother.

My four day-old son fell off our bed. My husband and I immediately took him to our local hospital, but after his first CT scan, which showed an epidural hematoma, he was transferred to UH. The **doctors in the ED** attended to my son immediately and thankfully, he did not require surgery. During the next 36 hours my son was given amazing care and support in the NICU. All the nurses were skilled and intelligent. Margaret Ozuzu, RN, was kind enough to make sure my husband I had a place to sleep, blankets and even a toothbrush. The nurses gave us continual updates and explained what they were doing. Despite the intensity of this situation, I was still able to learn about general baby care from the nurses. Thanks to the talented staff of the NICU, my son is home and doing very well.

It is such a great relief for family members to know your loved ones are being cared for by nurses who go the extra mile. These nurses did just that. I want to express my sincere gratitude to them for their professionalism and compassion. They should be honored for their continued commitment to the nursing profession.

Hats off to the dedicated staff who provided excellent care and a sense of safety to this patient.

I have been in the hospital for approximately 3 weeks and everyone here has been dedicated and devoted. They should be commended for a job well done. I would like to give a special thanks to all the nurses and nursing assistants on E-Blue. They were helpful, pleasant, and truly help those who cannot help themselves. In their presence, I felt safe and comfortable. I would also like to thank the Environmental Services staff, who ensured my room was clean from top to bottom. A special thanks to Lavern Allen, NM, for keeping everything and everyone in order. I love you all.
